


Jam chair - Claudio Dondoli & Marco Pocci - 2006

Congress elects Nancy Pelosi as the first female Speaker of the House in U.S. history. Opening of The New Museum of Contemporary Art, New York, designed by SANAA. Mount Ruapehu in Tongariro National Park in New Zealand, erupts.



Cuba and the United States reestablish full diplomatic relations, ending a 54-year hostility. The United Nations Security Council adopts Resolution 2199 to combat terrorism. Al-Qaeda's attack on Paris headquarters of satirical newspaper Charlie Hebdo. Queen Elizabeth II became the longest-reigning British monarch in history. NASA announces that liquid water has been found on Mars.



Apple Inc.becomes the world's first company to achieve a market capitalization of \$1 trillion.


